Covid-19 control measures are in place in our Church for your safety

Dear Parishioners

The updated guidance relating to Places of Worship from the Government and the Bishops of England and Wales was published last Thursday evening.

It emphasises that all places of worship should always consider the prevailing local conditions for the spread of the virus in deciding how to move forward. It is also important to mitigate against the risks of virus transmission.

At a time when Covid cases are rising rapidly across all areas of the Diocese, with some areas recording the highest infection rates in the country and when this is considered alongside the more elderly demographic of the Diocese, Bishop Robert feels it would present a very serious situation if we were to abandon our existing Covid controls.

Having taken both Clergy and Lay advice and due to the very high infection rates across all areas of the Diocese, Bishop Robert, in keeping with the "Health and Safety at Work Act 1974," asks that we retain all of the Covid control measures and cleaning protocols that we are currently following in all our churches and church halls until at least the end of August 2021.

The Bishop goes on to say that the virus is expected to peak in the middle of August. In September there will be a review of available data and guidance to allow a decision to be made regarding controls and protocols. If the data allows, we may then take a cautious and staged approach to the relaxation of controls and protocols.

In the light of his decision and with the ongoing generosity of our volunteer stewards we are still able to open St. Patrick's Church for Mass on Tuesday at 10.00, when no booking will be needed, and on Sunday at 10.30 when booking is advised to guarantee a place.

To reserve a place for Mass next Sunday, 25th July, please telephone **07526 232124** on Friday, 23rd July between **17.00** - **19.00**. This number will be unavailable outside of the above hours. Text messages cannot be accepted as a method of booking.

There are still places available for Mass this Sunday, 18th July, offered on a first come first served basis. Please bring Test and Trace details if you haven't reserved a place. You will receive a warm and reassuring welcome.

You will be encouraged to provide your name and telephone number to comply with the NHS Test and Trace system and also the number in your family if you are attending as a household. You should only sit with members of your own household or bubble. On arrival at the church you will be welcomed by a steward and your name will be checked against the booking list. If you have not pre-booked please bring your details in an envelope and place them in the box at the front of the church or give your details to the outside stewards. Alternatively you can use the QR Code displayed at the entrance to the Church using the NHS Covid App

For Mass on Tuesday, where booking is not required, you are invited to bring your Test and Trace details in an envelope and place them in the box in church

You may still be feeling a little hesitant about coming to Mass and that is perfectly understandable. The Sunday obligation is still suspended so you are under no obligation to attend Mass. You must not come to Church if you are experiencing any signs of Covid-19 or feeling unwell in any way.

Following Bishop Robert's decision, the wearing of face coverings, sanitising your hands, 2 metre social distancing and cleaning the church after each celebration remain in place within our church. The maximum capacity for any celebration remains at 70. So the church is as safe as we can possibly make it for you and our volunteer stewards will continue to look after you.

In the meantime, please continue to look after one another and pray that the Lord will watch over us and keep us safe from harm.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Following Bishop Robert's decision to extend the Covid restrictions to at least the end of August, we are still unable to open St. Patrick's Church for anything other than Mass on a Sunday and Tuesday and for funerals at present.

His decision also prevents us from reopening the parish centre. As a result we are not in a position to be able to offer the necessary baptismal preparation for parents who are considering presenting their child to the Church for Baptism.

Fr. Patterson regrets that it will still not be possible to offer the Sacrament of Baptism in St. Patrick's Church until the situation improves.

New Covid cases plateau.

This weeks update from Professor Tim Spector, the lead scientist on the ZOE COVID Study and Professor of Genetic Epidemiology at King's College London is worth 14 minutes of your time. You can view it here He talks about the number of cases in the UK and internationally, discusses his approach to the lifting of restrictions and offers six tips for the future:-

- 1. Respect other people give them space and don't presume they want a "bear hug!"
- 2. Socialise outdoors where you can or in a well ventilated space until the rates come down.
- 3. Wear a mask in a crowd where you can't keep a safe distance
- 4. Wash your hands and avoid touching your face.
- 5. Get your second jab
- 6. Look out for the symptoms of Covid (outlined below) and get a test
