The mind of the intelligent man will ponder a parable, and an attentive ear is the wise man's desire.

- 1. The upright shall rejoice at the presence of God; 2. Father of orphans, defender of widows: they shall exult with glad rejoicing. O sing to God; make music to his name. The LORD is his name.

But you have come to Mount Sion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant.

Gospel Acclamation

Take my yoke upon you, says the Lord, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart.

Gospel Luke 14:1, 7-14

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.' He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'

Journeying with the Word of God The Lord is glorified by the humble

Today's readings are a mixture of exhortations to be gentle and humble in our own lives, and to give practical hospitality to the poor.

The **First Reading** gives advice on humility in our behaviour and warns against pride. A wise person is attentive to God and gentle in all aspects of dealings with others.

The **Psalm** is a song of praise to the God who, in turn, is attentive to the orphan and widow, the poor and the lonely. The psalmist rejoices in the generous God who gives us new life.

The **Second Reading**, from Hebrews, is full of awe at the revelation of God's power. We have been given Jesus as our mediator, and our home is the heavenly Jerusalem.

Jesus's teaching in the **Gospel** is in the setting of a meal. His parable touches into our feelings of pride or shame and instructs us to be humble. Invitations to his banquet show a definite preference for the poor and lowly.

This week may we follow Jesus, who is 'gentle and humble of heart', in all that we say and do.
