For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time. For this I was appointed a preacher and an Apostle — I am telling the truth, I am not lying — a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth. I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarrelling.

At that time: Jesus said to the disciples, 'One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. And if you have not been faithful with that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.

Journeying with the Word of God Praise the Lord, who raises the poor

This week's readings challenge us to reflect on our attitude towards money. It should never displace our generous and just God from being at the centre of our lives. In the **First Reading**, Amos attacks those who take advantage of the poor and attempts to enslave them. God will remember their evil deeds.

The **Psalm** calls us to praise the Lord who from the height of his throne in heaven bends down to lift up the lowly and set them in the company of princes.

The **Second Reading** stresses that God wants *everyone* to be saved. So we are to pray for all, especially for those with authority over others in business or government.

In the **Gospel** Jesus tells us to be careful with money. Riches can rule us as a master would a slave, preventing us from using our God-given freedom to love and serve the Lord. Being faithful in small things helps us to focus on the 'genuine riches' in our lives.

This week, we might ask God to help us be more aware of the *real* riches in our lives and to be better able to love and serve the Lord through them.

Today is *Evangelii Gaudium* Sunday: A Message from Abbot Hugh Allan, Director of Mission at CBCEW: 'Evangelii Gaudium ('Joy of the Gospel') Sunday calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. It is a Sunday more commonly known as Home Mission Sunday, a day for us as the Catholic community in England and Wales to celebrate the beauty of our faith, and our shared commitment to witness to the fullness of life in Christ. Celebrating 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea, the theme for this year is "I believe..." as the heart of mission. The second collection on this weekend is to support the work carried out by the Bishops' Conference Mission Directorate.
