

First reading

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7
Thus says the LORD: Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law. 'I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.'

Responsorial Psalm The LORD will bless his people with peace. Ps 29(28)

1. Ascribe to the LORD, you heavenly powers, 2. The voice of the LORD upon the waters, the LORD on the immensity of waters; Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name; the voice of the LORD full of power; bow down before the LORD, majestic in the voice of the LORD full of splendour. Holiness.

Acts 10:34-38

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: 'Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all — you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.'

Journeying with the Word of God

'This is my Son the Beloved'

As Christmastide draws to a close, today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of The Lord which marks the start of Jesus' ministry on earth.

The **First Reading** from Isaiah tells of the qualities of justice and compassion that God's chosen one will bring to the earth. He will come to us as a servant leader endowed with the spirit of God.

Psalm 28 proclaims the Glory of God in creation and how the Lord will bless his people with peace.

In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter teaches the early church that the Good News proclaimed by Jesus is not just for the chosen few but for all people who love God (**Second Reading**).

In the **Gospel** of Matthew Jesus is baptised by his cousin John in the Jordan despite John wondering why it is not he who is being baptised by Jesus. Yet with humility and solidarity Jesus shows us the path to truth by entering into the waters of baptism. The Holy Spirit descends on Jesus, and God proclaims that Jesus is his beloved son. This is a dynamic relationship of eternal, creative self-giving love.

As Christians baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit we are called to follow Jesus in spreading the Good News to all people.

As we pray this week let us joyfully remember our baptismal promises so that we may follow Jesus more closely.
