For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarrelling among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each one of you says, 'I follow Paul', or 'I follow Apollos', or 'I follow Cephas', or 'I follow Christ.' Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise but to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

**Journeying with the Word of God
'Christ, our light and salvation!'**

The prophecy of Isaiah in today's **First Reading** tells of a time, 700 years before Christ, when the lands of Zebulun and Naphtali would sit no longer in darkness but be filled with glory.

Christ begins his ministry by choosing that very location, "those dwelling in the region and shadow of death", to shine a light into the darkest recesses of peoples' lives and so call them to him (**Gospel**).

Christ desires to shine that same light into our lives, to show us those hidden corners where we prefer egotism, exploitation and disharmony (**Second Reading**) to the lights of peace, harmony and solidarity.

Perhaps, this week, we may allow the Lord, 'our light and our salvation' (**Psalm**), to transform us that we might be a source of light to others.
