Journeying with the Word of God

Blessed are the poor in spirit: theirs is the kingdom of heaven

This Sunday's readings invite us to see our lives and values through God's eyes, rather than judging by human standards. Even when life hurts, we feel inadequate, or others disregard us, God's promised kingdom of justice and gentle compassion gives us cause for great hope and rejoicing.

In the **first reading**, the humble and lowly—those who hold fast to faith and integrity—are promised rest and tranquility in the Lord.

The **psalmist**, too, praises the Lord for his unfailing care for all the oppressed: the hungry, the captive, the blind, and the stranger.

The **Corinthians** are reminded that they were not chosen because they were exceptional people. Instead, God picks the ones others often dismiss, rather than the ones we might expect. None of us can boast in our own achievements, for we are 'in Christ Jesus' - all of our gifts are God's own work within us.

Jesus shows us the true heart of Christian living in the **Gospel**. In God's kingdom, it is not the rich, the successful and the powerful who are truly happy and fortunate, but the 'poor in spirit': the compassionate, the gentle, the persecuted, and the bereaved.

This week, then, we might ask God to help us see what being truly 'poor in spirit' means in our daily lives, and to recognise more and more our total dependence on God in Christ.
