For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

'Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn." But I say to you: Do not take an oath at all. Let what you say be simply "Yes" or "No"; anything more than this comes from evil.'

'the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

Today's readings reveal God's law as something different from human-made laws, which are imposed on people to keep them in check. God's law is born in love and given in love, and is fulfilled by our loving response to it.

Because God does not impose the law, we are always free to choose our response. God's loving and wise care (**Second Reading**) means that we are supported in our response (**First Reading**).

When we do respond lovingly, we will experience happiness on earth (**Psalm**) and know greatness in God's kingdom (**Gospel**).

Let's ask for the grace, in the coming week, to really seek the Lord with all our hearts. And to respond to the circumstances of our daily lives with loving wisdom, knowing that in everything we are being guided, held and encouraged by God's law of love.

The Season of Lent begins this Wednesday with the distribution of ashes. There will be two Masses this day, 10.00am at St Alban's, which will be led by the school children and 6.30pm at St Patrick's. All welcome.

Something to Follow for Lent: A Lenten Course focussed on helping people enter more deeply into prayer will be offered on **Wednesday evenings during Lent in St Patrick's Parish Centre, Felling at 6.30pm**, starting Wed 25th February. The course will offer lots of practical tips, wisdom from the bible, stories from the saints, and advice about common difficulties people face when praying. Each hour long session is based on a short filmed presentation by Fr. Stephen Wang, (Who is also the author of the Sycamore RCIA Course). Topics covered include:

Session 1 PRAYER FOR BEGINNERS Session 2 SEVEN RULES OF PRAYER

Session 3 PRAYING WITH THE BIBLE Session 4 HOW TO PRAY THE MASS


